Appointments of Graduate Research Assistants, International Fellows, Graduate Assistants, and Graduate Associates are contingent upon their full acceptance to a degree program and their enrollment as a full-time graduate student:

- * nine to twelve graduate credit hours per semester in the academic year.
- * at least three graduate hours in a summer session or nine credit hours if an MBA student.

Termination of these appointments occurs at the end of the contract period and for cause as detailed in the document entitled, "Graduate Assistants\Associates: Policies, Terms, and Conditions" which is furnished upon request by the Office of the Dean of Enrollment Management.

The individuals holding these appointments, for the purposes of benefits, are not considered state employees.
