## WAIVER OF TUITION AND GRANTING OF OTHER PRIVILEGES FOR SENIOR CITIZENS OF THE STATE OF MARYLAND

Frostburg State University will assure the policy to extend special privileges, where practicable, to senior citizens who are residents of the State of Maryland as approved by the University of Maryland System Board of Regents. The term "senior citizen" includes any individual who is sixty years of age or older, who is retired and whose chief income is derived from retirement benefits, and who is not employed full time. Privileges to be extended to such individuals shall include waiver of tuition for undergraduate and graduate courses, use of library, Physical Education Center facilities, Lane Center facilities, and access to all student/athletic activities which may be discounted to students.

## I. Waiver of Tuition

- A. This benefit is not available at Frostburg State
  University for self-support
  programs and courses.
- B. The exercise of this privilege shall be on a space available basis, and Frostburg State University shall be responsible for determining space availability. A senior citizen shall not be entitled to a waiver of tuition for more than three courses in a single academic semester or term.
- C. For purposes of this program, "tuition" is defined as the basic instructional charge for courses and does not include fees, such as those for application, registration, or other mandatory fees at Frostburg State University.
- D. A senior citizen may enroll in a degree granting program under these

policies only if he or she is admissible to that program at Frostburg State University.

- E. The full-time equivalent enrollment of senior citizens for whom tuition is waived shall not exceed two percent of Frostburg State
  University's full-time equivalent undergraduate enrollment.
- F. Frostburg State University's Office of Human Relations shall administer adopted procedures for this tuition waiver program under these policies.
- G. Frostburg State University shall report to the Chancellor, at the end of each semester or session, for submission to the Board of Regents, the number of senior citizens who have exercised the privilege of tuition waiver.

- II. Golden Identification Card Program
- A. Eligible senior citizens may apply for a Golden Identification Card from any institution in the University

System, which shall be honored throughout the System.

This card shall serve to identify the individual as eligible for privileges at Frostburg State University to include use of the Library, Physical Education Center facilities, Lane Center facilities, and access to all student/athletic activities which are free to students.

- B. Except for emergencies, the health care facilities at Frostburg State
  University will not be available to a holder of the Golden
  Identification Card.
- C. Frostburg State University has adopted and publicized procedures for, and privileges available under, the Golden Identification Card program.
